NFLSV AGREES TO RESPECT CAMBODIA'S BORDERS

(Editorial Report)—In a broadcast marred by very poor reception, Prince Sihanouk announces on 8 June, at the Damnak Chamcar Mon state palace in Phnom Penh, that at an official reception this morning at the state palace, the "ambassador" of the MFLSV delivered a letter from the NFLSV to the Chief of State.

Sihanouk says the letter stated that the NFLSV "agrees to recognize formally the territorial integrity of Cambodia within its present borders now and in the future." The letter continued, Sihanouk announces, that the NFLSV "wishes to proclaim to the world that it is making this solemn act of recognition, and that it promises to agree to respect forever the territorial integrity of Cambodia and its borders. It wishes to state, thirdly, that it resolutely opposes the acts of aggression by the agents of South Vietnam and Thailand, who serve the interests of the American imperialists and who wish to seize the Khmer territory, and that it will not allow them to do this."

Following this statement, Prince Sihanouk continues his press conference in French, declaring that he will nowread the declaration of the Central Committee of the NFLSV on the subject of the borders of Cambodia. He informs his audience that this declaration was cabled via Hanoi, that is to say, cabled by the Presidium of the NFLSV in Hanoi, and was transmitted from Hanoi to Phnom Penh in this way, as was the original letter of the presidium signed by NFLSV President Nguyen Huu Tho. Prince Sihanouk then reads the text of the declaration.

NFLSV RECOGNIZES CAMBODIA'S PRESENT BORDERS

Central Committee Statement

(Text) Hanoi, 8 June--The Central Committee of the South Vietnam National Liberation Front has issued a statement recognizing the territorial integrity of the Kingdom of Cambodia within its present borders, according to LIBERATION PRESS AGENCY.

The statement reads in full as follows:

Basing itself on the splendid development of the relations of neighborliness and brotherhood between the Vietnamese and Cambodian peoples on the basis of the five principles of peaceful coexistence, namely respect for each other's sovereignty and territorial integrity, nonaggression, noninterference in each other's internal affairs, equality and mutual benefit, and peaceful coexistence;

Basing itself on the present situation when the U.S. imperialists and their henchmen in Saigon and Bangkok are openly demanding to change Cambodia's present borders and repeatedly threatening the independence, sovereignty, neutrality, and territorial integrity of the Kingdom of Cambodia;

Responding to the 9 May 1967 communique of the Government of the Kingdom of Cambodia, which called on all countries to respect the territorial integrity of Cambodia in its present borders, the NFLSV Central Committee solemnly declares:

1--That it is the unswerving stand of the front to recognize and undertake to respect the territorial integrity of Cambodia in its present borders;

2--To recognize and undertake to respect the present border between South Vietnam and Cambodia;

3--Strongly condemns the schemes and acts of aggression of the U.S. imperialists and their henchmen in South Vietnam and Thailand against the Kingdom of Cambodia, and resolutely protests against all their plots to change the present borders of the Kingdom of Cambodia.

The policy of the NFLSV Central Committee concerning the borders of Cambodia, like its overall policy toward the Kingdom of Cambodia, conforms to the immediate interests of the two peoples in their struggle against the U.S. imperialists to defend each country's sacred national rights, as well as to the long-term interests of the two peoples in building their life in all fields according to their will.

(LIBERATION PRESS AGENCY commentary: "One more fine step in the development of friendship and militant solidarity between the South Vietnamese and Khmer peoples")

(Text) On 31 May the South Vietnam National Liberation Front Central Committee issued a statement on the Cambodian frontiers.

In this document the NFLSV Central Committee, first, confirmed its unwavering stand of recognizing and undertaking to respect Cambodian territorial integrity in its present frontiers; second, recognized and undertook to respect the present frontier between South Vietnam and Cambodia; and, third, strongly condemned the aggressive plots and actions of the U.S. imperialists and their lackeys in South Vietnam and Thailand against the Cambodian Kingdom.


