

SUBJ: Plan to Assist Khmer Communists by 5th NVA Division, Headquarters, SVNLA. (U)

(C-Oct 70) (36 pages, handwritten; B-3) Notebook, with entries dated between Oct 69 and Apr 70, maintained by Nguyễn, B29, Đoan 35, ((possibly an element of 5th NVA Division, Headquarters, SVNLA)), contains notes on Party Chapter activities, and rosters listing troop strength, Party strength, and Youth Group strength. Entry dated 17 Oct 69, records that B29 had a total personnel strength of 17 individuals, a Party Chapter of six members, and a Youth Group Chapter of seven members. Ranking personnel of the unit were Nguyễn Quang Đạt, Platoon Leader and Political cadre; Vũ Văn Nhông, Assistant Platoon Leader; and Nguyễn Văn Sáu, Nguyễn Thế Hồng, Dương Hữu Chính, Vũ Hồng Vang, Phạm Khắc Tô, Nguyễn Trọng Tài, Phạm Khắc Vôi, Trịnh Xuân Chiến, Phạm Văn Thù, and Tạ Duy Hào, Squad cadre.

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Entries dated between 30 Mar and 4 Apr 70, contains notes taken from minutes of a Party Committee conference, which concern a friendly ((VC/NVA)) plan to help K ((possibly Khmer Red, aka Khmer Communists)). The notes blamed the US for having caused the coup d'etat in Cambodia, and commented that the coup was conducted too early, because only two provinces supported it. Document states that in order to meet the situation, efforts should be concentrated to proselyte ((Cambodian)) civilians to support the effort to restore the position of Prince Sihanouk, to assist "K" to consolidate its organization and to take strong measures to deal with the Cambodian Puppet ((FANK)) troops. Friendly missions were to provide Cambodia with urgent, direct and overall assistance, but not as in the past. The friendly forces were to fight to materialize the plan of establishing an Indochina rear base ((for the Communists)). The plan not only help friendly Cambodians, but, also fulfill missions abroad. Efforts were to be devoted to reunifying the Cambodian people, restoring peace to Cambodia, and making Cambodia a neutral country. Immediate missions included intensifying propaganda activity to instigate civilian uprising and kill tyrants ((government officials)), and organizing them into ((armed)) units to attack the enemy, as was done for the ((Vietnamese)) people. Attention was also to be paid to helping Vietnamese nationals living in Cambodia. Documents state that if friendly forces had to remain ((in Cambodia)), defensive measures should be anticipated. Plans to form a government for Cambodia would be formulated in the future.
