NFLSV Central Committee And PRGRSV Appeal To South Vietnamese People On The Signing Of The Paris Agreement On Ending The War And Restoring Peace In Viet-Nam

Dear compatriots and combatants, the NFLSV Central Committee and the PRGRSV solemnly declare before all compatriots:

On 27 January 1973 the foreign ministers, plenipotentiaries of the DRV Government, the PRGRSV, the U.S. Government and the RVN Government, signed the Agreement on Ending the War and Restoring Peace in Viet-Nam. The main contents of the Agreement are:

The United States and all other countries undertake to respect the independence, sovereignty, unity and territorial integrity of Viet-Nam.

The United States will end the war of aggression completely, end its military involvement and intervention in the internal affairs of South Viet-Nam, respect the right to self-determination and guarantee the rights to freedom and democracy of the South Vietnamese people.

The South Vietnamese people will decide for themselves their own political future through a truly free and democratic general election.

The reunification of Viet-Nam shall be carried out step by step through peaceful means.

Dear compatriots and combatants, the U.S. imperialists' war has ended and peace has been restored in our country. This great victory is the result of 18 years of violent fighting and enduring tens of thousands of sacrifices, difficulties and hardships by all our heroic people and by our Southern armed forces and

people, who have fought on persistently, who were the first to fight and the last to win and who have always been worthy of being the brass fortress of the Fatherland.

All our nation is the victor. Anyone with Vietnamese blood in his veins, who truly loves the country and the people, has the right to be proud and share the glory.

Glory first of all belongs to the people's elite children-the war heroes who have sacrificed for the Fatherland. Glory belongs to the heroic Liberation Armed Forces that have scored many brilliant armed exploits and to all stalwart and brave children of the country who have braved terrorism and imprisonment, resolutely struggled and fought the Americans for national salvation to liberate the South.

This victory of the Vietnamese people is also the victory of the three fraternal countries' peoples of the Indochina Peninsula, who united in fighting the common enemy. Therefore our people's present duty is to strive in the spirit of national concord to unite the entire people, resolutely maintain true peace, independence and sovereignty, implement the rights to freedom

and democracy, improve the people's living conditions, build a peaceful, independent, democratic and prosperous South Viet-Nam and advance toward peace and national reunification.

The NFLSV and the PRGRSV solemnly declare that they will seriously and actively carry out all provisions of the signed Agreement and perseveringly struggle for their full implementation.

In this dignified hour in our history, the PRGRSV hopes the Saigon administration will place the Fatherland's interests above all, meet the requirements of our compatriots of various strata, through sincere consultations quickly set up the National Council of National Reconciliation and Concord of three equal segments at all echelons, and quickly proceed toward organizing truly free and democratic general elections so that the Southern people can freely decide on their political regime.

Let both sides conduct serious negotiations on all conditions and clauses of the Agreement, fully implement all the people's free and democratic rights, heal the war wounds, care for our compatriots' livelihood so they can live a happy, decent life soon, quickly establish normal relations in all aspects with the North and promote negotiations with the DRV government so as to proceed toward peace and reunification of the Fatherland.
