MME BINH STATEMENT DENOUNCES LON NOL CLIQUE

[Text] South Vietnam April 4 GPA--Mme Nguyen Thi Binh, president of the South Vietnam Liberation Women's Union, on March 30 issued a statement strongly condemning the U.S. imperialists' gross interference in the Khmer people's internal affairs, exposing the traitorous nature of the Lon Nol-Sirik Matak clique and reaffirming the South Vietnamese people's and women's unreserved support for the just struggle of the Khmer people and women.

The statement said that the South Vietnamese people and women strongly condemn the illegal coup d'etat staged by the pro-American elements in Cambodia on March 18 and fully support the 5-point declaration issued on March 23 by Samdech Norodom Sihanouk. They are solidly behind the March 26 statement of the Provisional Revolutionary Government of the Republic of South Vietnam in support of the Cambodian head of state's declaration.

It continued: "The South Vietnamese women are sincerely grateful for the wholehearted support of the Khmer people and women for their struggle against U.S. aggression, for national salvation. At the present conjuncture when the fraternal Khmer people are fearing the danger of a war of aggression by the U.S. imperialists, the South Vietnamese women wish to express their sincere feelings to the Khmer people and women pledging to strengthen their solidarity with the Khmer and Lao women in the struggle against the U.S. imperialist aggressors, the common enemy of our three nations."

In conclusion, the statement voiced the firm belief that the Khmer people, under the leadership of Samdech Head of State Norodom Sihanouk--the eminent political--[as received] will shatter all schemes of aggression by the U.S. imperialists, liberating Cambodia from the yoke of the traitors and restoring Cambodia's independence, sovereignty and neutrality.
