CAMBODIAN DELEGATION LEAVES PEKING FOR HANOI

Departure From Peking

Peking NCHA in English 0249 GMT 30 Aug 75 OW

[Text] Peking, August 30, 1975 (HSINHUA) A delegation of the National United Front and the Royal Government of National Union of Cambodia led by its leader Samdech Norodom Sihanouk, head of state and chairman of the National United Front, and its deputy leader Khieu Samphan, deputy prime minister of the Royal Government of National Union and commander-in-chief of the people's armed forces of national liberation, left here for Hanoi by special plane this morning to attend the celebrations of the 30th anniversary of the founding of the Democratic Republic of Vietnam. Princess Monique Sihanouk left by the same plane.

The members of the delegation are Ieng Thirith, minister of popular education and youth of the RGNUC, and Keat Chhon, alternate member of the Political Bureau of the NUFC Central Committee.

The delegation was seen off at the airport by Samdech Penn Nouth, chairman of the Political Bureau of the NUFC Central Committee and prime minister of the RGNUC, and Madame Penn Nouth; Thiounn Dum and Duong Sam Ol, members of the Political Bureau of the NUFC Central Committee, and Madame Duong Sam Ol; Van Piny, vice-minister of foreign affairs of the RGNUC, and Madame Van Piny.

Seeing the delegation off at the airport were Teng Hsiao-ping and Li Hsien-nien, vice-premiers, Wu Te and Tan Chen -lin, vice chairmen of the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress, Han Nien-lung, vice-minister of foreign affairs, and leading members of departments concerned Lin Chia-mei, Chu Chuan-hsien and Liang Peng, as well as Chinese Ambassador to Cambodia Sun Hao.

Present were Nguyen Trong Vinh, ambassador to China of the Democratic Republic of Vietnam, and Nguyen Thanh Cong, charge d'affaires ad interim of the Embassy of the Republic of South Vietnam in Peking.

On hand were also Cambodian Ambassador to China Toch Kham Doeun and his wife, members of the NUFC and the royal family as well as Cambodian trainees in Peking.

CANTON TV: MAO, CAMBODIANS MEET

[Editorial Report ON] Canton Domestic Television Service in Mandarin, relaying Peking TV at 1100 GMT on 30 August, carries a 1.5 minute filmed report on Mao's meeting with Sihanouk and other Cambodian guests on the evening of 27 August.

The film opens with a view of international flags followed by shots of a car drawing up in front of a building. Sihanouk and his wife are shown emerging from the car. Teng Hsiao-ping is shown to the right of the screen stretching out his arms to embrace and then shake hands with Sihanouk. He then shakes hands with Madame Sihanouk. Foreign Ministry officials Chi Tsung-hua and Chu Chuan-hsien can be seen looking on in the background. The camera then cuts to shots of Penn Nouth and his wife getting out of another car. They are greeted in the same manner by Teng. The camera shows Khieu Samphan and Ieng Thirith getting out of a third car, with Teng Hsiao-ping similarly embracing and shaking hands with both.

Next is shown the interior of a room with a group of people entering through the door. Sihanouk is shown in front followed by Hsieh Yueh-o, Madame Sihanouk, Penn Nouth, Madam Penn Nouth, Khieu Samphan, Ieng Thirith and Teng Hsiao-ping.

The camera shows Sihanouk stepping forward, grasping Mao's hands in a double handshake and bowing twice. Mao next shakes hands with Madame Sihanouk, while Wang Hai-jung stands by her side, speaking as though introducing her. After Madame Sihanouk, Penn Nouth steps forward to have a double handshake with Mao. With his right hand still clasped by Penn Nouth, Mao raises his left arm and shakes his index finger at Penn Nouth while they exchange remarks. Sihanouk and his wife are shown looking on and smiling. Next to shake Mao's hand is Madame Penn Nouth, who is followed by Khieu Samphan. Mao has a double handshake with him and smiles broadly. Then, after a brief handshake with Ieng Thirith, Mao shakes hands with Teng Hsiao-ping. He again smiles and turns to face Sihanouk before the camera cuts to a shot of fluttering Chinese and Cambodian national flags.

The camera then cuts to the exterior of the building and shows the group coming out, with Teng Hsiao-ping and Sihanouk in front. They are immediately followed by Hsieh Yueh-o who is seen talking all the way, presumably interpreting. Behind Hsieh Yueh-o are Madame Sihanouk and Penn Nouth. Teng Hsiao-ping is shown shaking hands with Sihanouk before the camera cuts to shots of Sihanouk and his wife entering the car. The film ends with two cars driving away in the darkness.

The total duration of Mao's appearance is 40 seconds.

The announcer's narrative reads: "On the evening of 27 August, Chairman Mao Tsetung met with the distinguished Cambodian guests. The distinguished guests were received by Vice Premier Teng Hsiao-ping at the entrance.

"Chairman Mao warmly shook hands with Samdech Norodom Sihanouk, Cambodian head of state and chairman of the NUFC, and Madame Sihanouk; Samdech Penn Nouth, chairman of the NUFC and prime minister of the RGNUC, and Madame Penn Nouth; Khieu Samphan, deputy prime minister of the RGNUC and commander in chief of the Cambodian People's National Liberation Armed Forces; and Ieng Thirith, minister of popular education and youth,

"Chairman Mao had a conversation with the distinguished guests. A cordial and friendly atmosphere prevailed throughout the meeting.

"Present at the meeting were Vice Premier Teng Hsiao-ping, Vice Foreign Minister Wang Hai-jung, deputy department directors of the Foreign Ministry Chi Tsung-hua and Tang Wen-sheng, and Hsieh Yueh-o."

This filmed report was shown twice in the same transmission.
