SIHANOUK KEEPS INFORMATION ON CAMBODIAN SITUATION FROM PRESS

Paris AFP in English 1045 GMT 6 May 75 OW

[Text] Peking, May 6 (AFP)--Prince Norodom Sihanouk is continuing to keep secret from the press all reports reaching him here on the current situation in his country.

His office today distributed a message from the Khmer Rouge leader Khieu Samphan, dated May 4, in which Mr Khieu Samphan, deputy premier of the Royal Government of Cambodian National Union (GRUNC) gave a "detailed report on the situation in Cambodia." However, in the text distributed to the press, the report is replaced by a line of dots.

On April 25 Prince Sihanouk censored in a similar way passages on the situation in Cambodia in an initial message sent to him by Mr Khieu Samphan.

MALIK COMMENTS ON CAMBODIA TIES, DRV-PRG UN MEMBERSHIP

Jakarta Domestic Service in Indonesian 1200 GMT 6 May 75 BK

[Text] Foreign Minister Adam Malik said that current developments in Indochina will expedite efforts to implement the declaration for turning Southeast Asia into a zone of peace, freedom and neutrality. Prior to the present developments in Indochina, the Southeast Asian declaration, the concept of which was approved by ASEAN in 1972, could not be implemented. Malik believed that with the termination of the war in Indochina, the declaration can now be implemented.

Foreign Minister Malik also told newsmen today that Indonesia is waiting for the right opportunity to reopen its diplomatic mission in Phnom Penh. Steps toward this end have been taken through official channels; however there is no response yet, he said.

In reply to questions concerning foreign military bases in Southeast Asia, Malik said that the time has come for closing all foreign bases in this region and the withdrawal of all foreign military personnel from it. He further said that Indonesia will support the entry of the PRGSRV and the DRV into the United Nations, if both apply for membership in the world organization. Whether they want to make one or two Vietnams is their business, Malik said.
