SIMANOUS RECEIVES NELSV PRESIDIUM MEMBER

(Text) Hanor, 15 June---Cambodian Chief of State Prince Norodom Sinanouk on E June gave a formal and very cordial reception to Professor Aguyen Van Hieu, member of the Presidium of the NFLSV Central Committee, at the Chamcarmon State Falage, according to the South Vietnam LIPERATION PRESS AGENCY correspondent in Finite Font

Erofessor Mguyen Van Hieu handed the Cambodian Chief of State the statement, dated 31 May 1967, of the NPLSV Central Committee recognizing and undertaking to respectine present borders between South Vietnam and Cambodia Herreaffirmed the unswerving stand of the front to strengthen the friendly relations with Cambodia and the militant solidarity between the people of Vietnam and Cambodia is the struggle against the common enemies -- the U.S. imperialist aggressors and their henchmen.

Cambodian Chief of State Prince Morodom Sihanouk warmly thanked the NWLSV for its correct attitude with regard to the border question, and thanked the front and the South Vietnamese people for their support to the struggle of the Cambodian people and government to defend their national independence, peace, and neutrality.
