NGUYEN HUU THO SENDS MESSAGE TO CONFERENCE ON CAMBODIA

[NFLSV Chairman Nguyen Huu Tho's 7 December message to the international conference on Cambodia]

[Text] Respectfully to the international conference on Cambodia:

On the occasion of the opening of the international conference on Cambodia, on behalf of the Vietnamese people and on my own behalf, I convey to the delegates my warm greetings. We enthusiastically welcome the concern of the peaceful, democratic and progressive forces regarding the Cambodian situation. This is because at the present time, although the Paris agreement on Vietnam and the Vientian agreement on Laos have been signed, the U.S. Government has yet to change its Indochina policy--especially that concerning Cambodia--despite the condemnation by U.S. and world public opinion.

The Nixon administration continues to introduce weapons and money into Cambodia so the lackey Lon Nol clique can continue the war and commit more crimes against the Cambodian people. Extremely indignant over the barbarous crimes perpetrated by the U.S. imperialists and their lackeys in Cambodia, the South Vietnamese people are very elated over the great and comprehensive victories of the Cambodian people over the past years during their struggle against the schemes and acts of aggression by the imperialists and their lackey; and especially in the recent past, under the clear-sighted leadership of the NUFC and the RGNUC headed by Chief of State Samdech Norodom Sihanouk.


Faithful to the joint statement of the Indochinese Peoples' Summit Conference, the South Vietnamese people, the NFLSV and the PRGRSV resolutely support the fraternal Cambodian people's great patriotic struggle until final victory. We resolutely support the five-point declaration of 23 March 1970 by Chief of State Samdech Norodom Sihanouk, resolutely support the serious stand of the NUFC and the RGNUC concerning settlement of the Cambodian issue, and demand that the U.S. government end its support for the country-selling Lon Nol clique and its intervention in Cambodia's internal affairs.

At the present time the Nixon administration is not only intervening in Cambodia, but is also continuing to use the lackey Nguyen Van Thieu administration to seriously sabotage the Paris agreement on Vietnam and repeatedly and violently bomb many areas under PRGRSV control, and use Thai forces to attack and capture the liberated areas in Laos--thereby making the situation in Indochina very tense.

Thus far we have always highly evaluated the positive and effective activities conducted by the peaceful, democratic and progressive forces in the world, which have frequently and regularly coordinated with the Vietnamese, Lao and Cambodian peoples in the struggle against the war of aggression by the U.S. imperialists in the Indochinese countries.

We hope that at this important conference, the delegates will enact positive and urgent measures to support the Cambodian people's struggle, check the U.S. Government's acts and schemes of resuming the war in South Vietnam and demand that the U.S. Government and the Saigon administration scrupulously implement the Paris agreement on Vietnam and help in the implementation of the Vientiane agreement on Laos. We wish the conference fine success.
