JFK'S OLD ARGUMENTS COVER U.S. MANEUVER

Hanoi, in Vietnamese to South Vietnam, Mar. 25, 1961, 1030 GMT--S

(Text) In a press conference held on Mar. 23, Kennedy, in order to fool world opinion, resumed the old arguments that the United States favors the building of a free and independent Laos. However, such a statement can not camouflage the artful maneuvers of the U.S. imperialists and their false sense of charity and justice. Everyone knows that it is the U.S. imperialists who have continued to undermine the 1954 Geneva agreements on Laos, and for three years to check the reactivation of the ISCC, and who have incited their lackeys to expel this international organization from Laos because the ISCC has the duty to assure the independence and neutrality of Laos as provided by the Geneva agreements.

Kennedy also revived the slanderous charge of the Foster Dulles warlike clique that North Vietnamese militarymen (have entered?) Laos. On this point, Prince Souvanna Phouma has clearly stressed that there are no foreign forces in Laos except Thai and South Vietnamese soldiers.

U.S.-SEATO Maneuver

(Text) Faced with the continuous failures, military as well as political, of the U.S. lackeys in Laos, U.S. President Kennedy hastened to convene a conference of top officials to discuss plans to intensify their intervention in Laos. However, in a recent press conference, Kennedy resumed the old argument that the U.S. supports the building of an independent and neutral Laos.

Such a statement cannot fool world opinion, however, nor can it camouflage the evil intentions of the U.S. imperialists in Laos. Everyone knows that it is the U.S. imperialists who have undermined the 1954 Geneva agreement on Laos and who are now discussing with their lackeys of the SEATO bloc in Bangkok plans to carry out their bandit-like activities in Laos.
